Please be mindful of your pets and the distress summer heat in PWS brings. When you leave your home, your neighbors ask that your dog be left inside your home, not outside in the heat. Often, they will often bark the entire time of your absence.

With Summer temps rising, dogs are susceptible to heat stroke and can die within minutes of an occurrence. Barking can be interpreted as a distress call from the dog, combining that with uncomfortable temperatures is a recipe for disastrous results.

A walker was attacked by a loose dog a few weeks ago. Her leashed dog sustained several injuries and there was a hefty vet bill. Please keep your dog fenced, or inside your home. DO NOT let your pets run free.

There was a rare occurrence of a Pinewood dog becoming very ill after eating a mushroom found in Pinewood. Be aware that while rare, it can happen.

This year the **Perseid Meteor Shower**, July 14-Aug 24, will peak around **Aug. 13, 2023**. The skies in Pinewood are amazing. Please remember to leave your outside lights off so we all can better enjoy the night sky.
