Special Budget Hearing

The Special Budget Hearing was called to order at 7:06 pm.

Those present included Board Members Dan DeKrey, John Berlin, Astonna McCoy and David Gregory; District employees Carl Pender and Gabi Benson. Secretary Danielle Andres was excused.

Treasurer Astonna McCoy presented the budget for 2011. After discussion, Dan DeKrey moved to accept the proposed 2011 Budget with the changes noted. John Berlin seconded. No further discussion, motion was passed unanimously.

Dan then motioned to close the Special Hearing. John Berlin seconded. No further discussion, motion was passed unanimously. Meeting closed at 7:14.

Special Rules and Regulations Hearing

The Special Rules & Regulation Hearing was called to order at 7:15 p.m.

After continuing the discussion from previous meeting about changes to all the rates for water service, a motion was made by Treasurer Astonna McCoy to increase the current Base rate from \$42.00 to \$50.00; to increase the System Improvement Fee from \$6.15 to \$8.25, to increase the water charges from \$0.30 per 100 up to 3000 gallons to \$0.50 per 100; to increase the second tier of \$0.50 per 100 gallons to \$0.75; and to increase the late fee to a flat rate of \$3.00. Due date will be changed to 24th of the month, with the late fee added the last day of the month if the account is not paid. Dan DeKrey seconded the motion. No further discussion, motion was passed unanimously. Meeting closed at 7:53.
